You have a poster repair kit composed of pens (matching the color ink you used for your font), correction fluid, transparent tape, and a cloth to wipe away potential smudge marks You have rehearsed a "walkthrough" (mentally or in front of a practice audience) so the first time you present your poster is not in front of a real audience	You have breath mints you can easily access when presenting for multiple hours
	Supplemental materials are easily accessible
	If you are interested in seeing posters presented at the same time as yours, you have quick access to the location so you can stop by quickly without having to be absent from your poster for long
